#### **Elk on the Trail**

On Route 2, in Florida MA, at Whitcomb Summit is an eight foot tall Elk standing on a rough cut three foot high granite base. The planning of this monument had its start with the Greenfield Lodge of Elks. The plaque on the base reads;

> THE ELK ON THE TRAIL IN MEMORY OF THE BROTHERS OF THE MASSACHUSETTS ELKS ASSOCIATION WHO DIED IN THE WORLD WAR ERECTED BY THE ASSOCIATION 17TH JUNE 1923.

This year's Elk on the Trail dedication event is scheduled for June 17, 2017. The Greenfield Lodge will host a breakfast from 9:00 AM to 10:30 AM. A five dollar donation is requested. At noon on Whitcomb Summit there will be a service and wreath laying by all Lodges in attendance. Upon completion those in attendance head to the North Adams Lodge for a luncheon. All members are welcome to attend.

The Walk for ENF is a State Association Event and is open to all members, their families and friends. #### Days on Which to Display Your Flag

The flag should be displayed on all days and especially on all national and state holidays and on historic and special occasions.

January 1 – New Year's Day January 20 – Inauguration Day Third Monday in January – Martin Luther King's Birthday February 12 - Lincoln's Birthday Third Monday in February – Washington's Birthday April 6 – Army Day Easter Sunday Second Sunday in May – Mother's Day Third Saturday in May – Armed Forces Day The Last Monday in May – Memorial Day (half-staff until noon) June 14 – Flag Day July 4 – Independence Day First Monday in September – Labor Day September 17 – Citizenship Day Second Monday in October – Columbus Day October 27 - Navy Day November 11 - Veterans' Day Fourth Thursday in November – Thanksgiving Day December 25 – Christmas Day Days proclaimed by the President Days of states' admission to the Union

Certain holidays will be celebrated on Mondays, or on the date traditionally recognized for that holiday, according to state option. If your state has not enacted the necessary legislation, the flag may be flown on both the Monday holiday and on the traditional date for the holiday.
