I wish to thank the members of the Greenfield lodge for allowing me to represent our lodge at the Grand Lodge National Convention in Reno NV. The opening ceremony with the parade of flags was impressive with about 3,000 Elks in attendance. Maintaining membership has been a losing battle for the last 30 years. However, this past year nationally we came the closest to a gain with a total loss of less than 0.009 %. We have two new members coming in on September 12, but sadly our in Memoriam list the loss of 3 members. There were 19 resolutions that were voted on at this year's convention. The lodge officers will be reviewing the resolutions that passed and informing the membership of any changes that are required.

The total Elk's charitable giving for this year is expected to exceed the 2015-2016 figure of \$282,160,455.00 in cash and non cash contributions, hours worked and miles traveled. All of this in support of our children, veterans and communities. Thanks for being an Elk. This was my first convention, but I was accompanied by 4 PER's from our lodge. It was a great time. In just five month this project went from serving 12 – 15 vets at the first luncheon to now serving 50 to 70 every Thursday.
